She advocates for strategic use of concrete safety interventions such as checklists and improvements to the electronic medical record. but focuses on the fullscale cultural and cognitive shifts required to make a meaningful dent in medical error.

Woven throughout the book are the powerfully human stories that Dr. Ofri is renowned for. The errors she dissects range from the hardly noticeable missteps to the harrowing medical cataclysms.
